
QUEEN'S BENCH JUVENILE HALL PROJECT

For over 40 years, Queen's Bench has positively impacted the lives of girls involved in the juvenile justice system through this flagship community project. Volunteers with the Juvenile Hall Project meet on the 1st and 3rd Wednesday of each month at the SF Juvenile Detention Center to spend time with the girls. These evenings provide opportunities for creative self-expression and mentorship from strong female role models.



Creative & Enriching Activities

The evening usually consists of an hour-long arts and crafts project while engaging the girls in informal conversation. Past activities include decorating reusable tote bags, creating vision boards, poetry writing, and workshops on self-love, goal setting and positive affirmations.

The Juvenile Hall Project is always in need of volunteers to participate in the bi-monthly visits. Although regular attendance is encouraged to establish relationships with the girls, all volunteers are welcome to come when they can. Carpooling and transportation can be arranged too!
